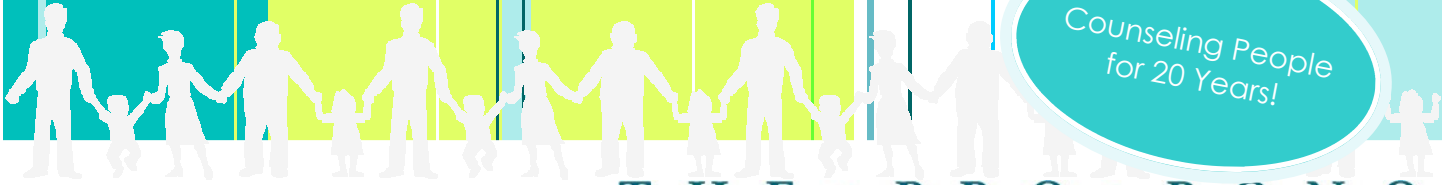

Snapshot of Need in Maryland

- ◇ Served 18,000 families, couples & individuals in 20 yrs.
- ◇ 1 in 5 people suffer from depression or anxiety
- ◇ Requests for care increased 25% in the past 3 years
- ◇ Call volume has increased 61% in six years
- ◇ We maintain 400+ active cases at all times

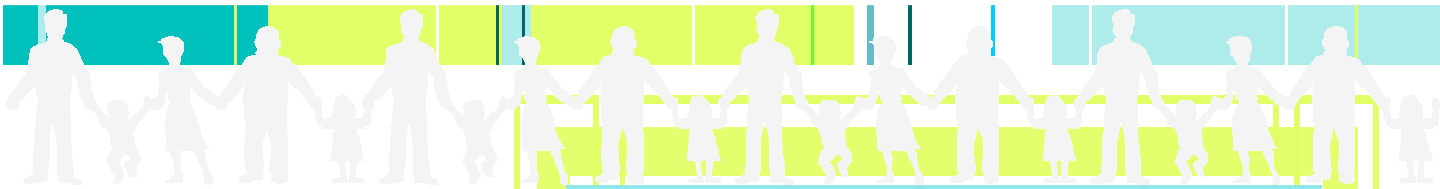

Providing Access to Services

Reaching Out to Clients

- ◆ Jean Steirn Cancer Program—Support for men, women and children with a diagnosis of cancer
